

NEW LOOK, NEW ENERGY: PERTH GARDEN SHOW 2025 A STANDOUT SUCCESS

The new look Perth Garden Show returned to the grounds of McCallum Park last weekend to the delight of West Australian gardeners.

The Perth Garden Show, formerly known as Perth Garden Week, has been an important event on the calendar since 1972 and is owned and managed by the Nursery and Garden Industry of WA. Every year it attracts plant enthusiasts, horticultural experts, and even those who wish they had a green thumb; and the result is dozens of plants being sold and taken home to be established in West Aussie gardens.

The 2025 Perth Garden Show was presented by the Water Corporation. The event covered an area of almost 30,000 sqm of parkland within Taylor Reserve in Victoria Park. The Show attracted more than 100 exhibitors from gardening, landscaping, nursery and outdoor living genres, and saw almost 11,000 people through the gates over the three days. The culmination of a huge plant market, outdoor living services and lifestyle products with different entertainment and information zones made the 2025 Perth Garden Show a diverse, exciting and educational event for anyone who enjoys plants and gardens.

Feedback from visitors was wholly positive, with many praising the new location and the diversity of exhibitors and attractions. Comments on social media included "way better than last year"; "more variety in plants", "this year's show was more down to earth and for real gardeners", and "best organised show in years". NGIWA President Ross Hooper was extremely pleased with the success of the Show, saying it was a great choice moving the event to McCallum Park.

"The excitement and buzz of the Perth Garden Show 2025 was evident all weekend, from the official launch to the exhibitor's sundowner, I felt there was a great positive energy and camaraderie with everyone involved who made this event so special," Ross said.

"The venue, back at McCallum Park is an ideal location for the Garden Show with its leafy surrounds of mature trees, and a backdrop of Perth City across the Swan River. Of note was the amazing collaboration with the Kalamunda Garden Festival creating their own Patch within the show, supporting smaller stall holders to book for a day or two and get involved."

"This year Zanthorrea Nursery took a 200 sqm site and filled it with some beautiful Australian plants and local artist's products. There was plenty of interest and plenty of happy customers through the gates."

"I am very much looking forward to seeing the Perth Garden Show grow from strength to strength as Perth's premier gardening event," Ross said.
